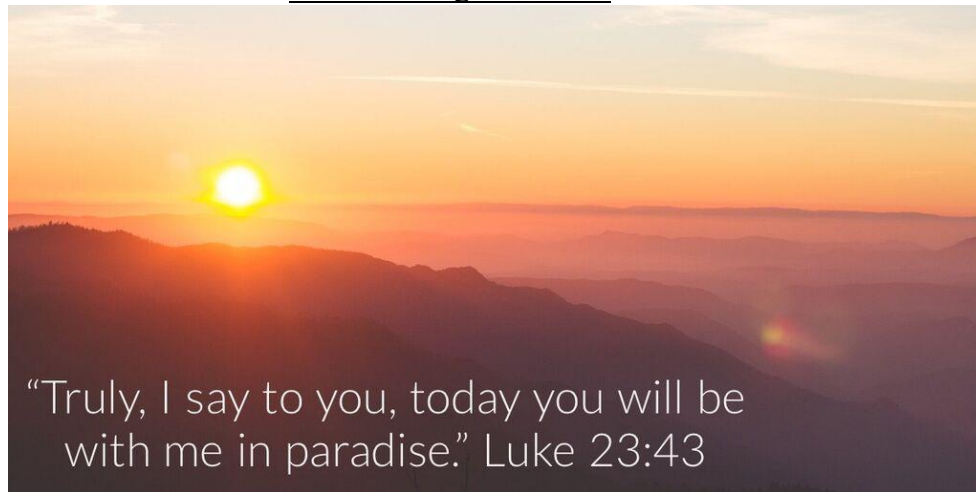

Now that we have been put right with God through faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ. He has brought us by faith into this experience of God's grace, in which we now live. And so we boast of the hope we have of sharing God's glory.

We also boast of our troubles, because we know that trouble produces endurance, endurance brings God's approval, and God's approval creates hope. This hope does not disappoint us, for God has poured out his love into our hearts by means of the Holy Spirit, who is God's gift to us.

#3 A Reading from the Second Letter of Saint Paul to the Corinthians

If you are afflicted by pain or loss, we ask you to endure it with hope.
For just as you have shared in Christ's suffering, so, too, will you share in His Resurrection.

My brothers and sisters, we do not wish to leave you in the dark about the pain that you are experiencing, for you feel you are crushed beyond all strength; Even to the point of despairing of life.

But I will not leave you abandoned to despair. We pray that you might have trust, not in yourselves, but in the God that raised the dead, the God who gives life.

All of you must help us with your prayer, so that on our behalf, God can be thanked for the gift of life he has granted us.

#4 A Reading from St. Paul's Letter to the Romans

Hope does not disappoint, because the love of God has been poured out into our hearts through the Holy Spirit that has been given to us. For Christ, while we were still helpless, died at the appointed time for the ungodly. Indeed, only with difficulty does one die for a just person, though perhaps for a good person one might even find courage to die.

But God proves his love for us in that while we were still sinners Christ died for us. How much more then, since we are now justified by his blood, will we be saved through him from the wrath. Indeed, if, while we were enemies, we were reconciled to God through the death of his Son, how much more, once reconciled, will we be saved by His life. Not only that, but we also boast of God through our Lord Jesus Christ, through whom we have now received reconciliation.

#5 A Reading from the Second Letter of St. Paul to Timothy

I am already poured out like a libation, I have fought the good fight, I have finished the race, I have kept the faith, from now on a merited crown awaits me. On that day, the Lord, just judge that He is, will award it to me, and not only to me but to all who have looked for his appearing with eager longing.

But the Lord stood by my side and gave me strength, that is how I was saved.
The Lord will continue to rescue me from all attempts to do me harm
and He will bring me safe to His heavenly kingdom to Him be glory forever and ever. Amen.

#6 A Reading from the first Letter of St. Paul to the Thessalonians

We do not want you to be unaware, brothers and sisters, about those who have fallen asleep, so that you may not grieve like the rest, who have no hope.

For if we believe that Jesus died and rose, so too will God, through Jesus, bring with him those who have fallen asleep.

And so we shall always be with the Lord. Therefore, console one another with these words.

#7 A Reading from the First letter of John

My children, our love should not be just words and talk; it must be true love, which shows itself in action.

This, then, is how we will know that we belong to the truth; this is how we will be confident in God's presence. If our conscience condemns us, we know that God is greater than our conscience and that He knows everything.

We receive from him whatever we ask, because we obey His commands and do what pleases Him. What He commands is that we believe in His Son, Jesus Christ and love one another, just as Christ commanded us. Those who obey God's commands live in union with God and God lives in union with them. And because of the Spirit that God has given us, we know that God lives in union with us.

#8 A Reading from the Second letter of Paul to the Corinthians

For this reason we never become discouraged even though our physical being is renewed day after day. And this small and temporary trouble we suffer will bring us a tremendous and eternal glory, much greater than the trouble. For we fix our attention, not on things that are seen, but on things that are unseen. What can be seen lasts only for a time, but what cannot be seen lasts forever.

For we know that when this tent we live in--our body here on earth is torn down, God will have a house in heaven for us to live in, a home God has made, which will last forever. God is the one who has prepared us for this change, and he gave us his Spirit as the guarantee of all that he has in store for us.

So we are always full of courage. We know that as long as we are at home in the body, we are away from the Lord's home. For our life is a matter of faith, not of sight. We are full of courage and would much prefer to leave our home in the body and be at home with the Lord.

#9 A Reading from the First Letter of John

See what love the Father has bestowed to us that we may be called the children of God. Yet, so we are. The reason that the world does not know us, is that it did not know Jesus either.

Beloved, we are God's children now; what we shall be, has not yet been revealed. We do know that when it is revealed, we shall be like him as he is.

The Word of the Lord

#10 A Reading from Paul's Letter to the Romans

Those who are led by the Spirit of God are children of God. For you did not receive a spirit of slavery to fall back into fear, but you received a spirit of adoption, through which we cry, "Abba, Father!" The Spirit itself bears witness with our spirit that we are children of God, and if children, then heirs, heirs of God and joint heirs with Christ, if only we suffer with him so that we may also be glorified with him.

I consider that the sufferings of this present time are as nothing compared with the glory to be revealed for us. For creation awaits with eager expectation the revelation of the children of God; for creation was made subject to futility, not of its own accord but because of the one who subjected it, in hope that creation itself would be set free from slavery to corruption and share in the glorious freedom of the children of God. We know that all creation is groaning in labor pains even now; and not only that, but we ourselves, who have the first fruits of the Spirit, we also groan within ourselves as we wait for adoption, the redemption of our bodies.

#11 A Reading from the Letter of Paul to the Romans

If God is for us, who can be against us? He who did not spare his own Son but handed him over for us all, how will he not also give us everything else along with him? Who will bring charge against God's chosen ones? It is God who acquits us. Who will condemn? It is Christ Jesus who died, rather, was raised, who also is at the right hand of God, who indeed intercedes for us.

What will separate us from the love of Christ? Will anguish or distress or persecution or famine or nakedness or peril or the sword? No, in all these things we conquer overwhelmingly through him who loved us. For I am convinced that neither death, nor life, nor angels, nor principalities, nor present things, nor future things, nor powers, nor height, nor depth, nor any other creature will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord. #12 A Reading from the First Letter of Saint John

Beloved, let us love one another, because love is of God; everyone who loves is begotten by God and knows God. Whoever is without love does not know God, for God is love.

In this way the love of God was revealed to us: God sent his only Son into the world so that we might have life through him.

In this is love: not that we have loved God, but that he loved us and sent his Son as expiation for our sins. Beloved, if God so loved us, we also must love one another.

No one has ever seen God. Yet, if we love one another, God remains in us, and his love is brought to perfection in us.

#13 A Reading from the Letter of Paul to the Romans

Are you unaware that we who were baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death?

We were indeed buried with him through baptism into death, so that, just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, we too might live in newness of life. If, then, we have died with Christ, we believe that we shall also live with him.

We know that Christ, raised from the dead, dies no more; death no longer has power over him.

#14 A Reading from the Letter of St. Paul to the Romans

Brothers and sisters:

No one lives for oneself, and no one dies for oneself. For if we live, we live for the Lord, and if we die, we die for the Lord; so then, whether we live or die, we are the Lord's. For this is why Christ died and came to life, that he might be Lord of both the dead and the living. Why then do you judge your brother? Or you, why do you look down on your brother? For we shall all stand before the judgment seat of God; for it is written:

'As I live, says the Lord, every knee shall bend before me,
And every tongue shall give praise to God.'

So then each of us shall give an accounting of himself to God.

Guidelines for *Words of Remembrance*

"I am the resurrection and the life, whoever believes in me will live forever."

To the family member or friend who will be delivering *Words of Remembrance* at a funeral liturgy: Please accept the condolences of the pastor and parish staff as you mourn the passing of your loved one from this world.

The family has entrusted you with a sacred task in asking you to "speak in remembrance" of the departed on their behalf. The following guidelines are provided to help you prepare and deliver your remarks.

To "speak in remembrance" at a funeral liturgy means to offering a brief reflection on the life of the deceased in the context of his or her life of faith. These liturgical *Words of Remembrance* are not the same as the secular understanding of a "eulogy," which is a reminiscing and toasting of the departed.

In preparing *Words of Remembrance*, it might be helpful to reflect on the qualities of the deceased that made him or her a good person. A brief story or example could help to illustrate a particular point.

Past experience has made it necessary for the parish to require funeral speakers to adhere to the following guidelines. These are designed to respect the sacredness of the ceremony as well as the dignity of the deceased.

- **Only one person may deliver the *Words of Remembrance* at the funeral liturgy.**
- **The celebrant will invite you forward by name after the prayer after communion.**

Thank you for your cooperation to assure a dignified celebration of the liturgy and the life of the deceased. Once again, please know of our sincere sympathy during this time of loss.
